Why moths?

- Moths are among the most diverse and successful organisms on Earth.
- Scientists estimate there are **150,000 to 500,000 moth species**.
- Their colors and patterns are either dazzling or so cryptic that they define camouflage. Moths can be as small as a pinhead or as large as an adult's hand.
- Most moths are nocturnal, but some fly in daylight like butterflies.
- **Finding moths** is as simple as leaving on a porch light after dark. Serious moth aficionados use special lights and baits to attract them.
- 2015 is the Year of the Sphinx moth, which serve as important pollinators
